PERFECT:
FOR AND SINCE**

We studied this last year. Try to remember! 😊 But, soon we will studied Present Perfect Continuous too.

USE OF THE PRESENT PERFECT

- We use it for a period of time that happened in the past and continues until the present.
- For example:
 - I HAVE SEEN a lot of horror movies.
 - SHE HAS BOUGHT the newspaper.

FORM

➤ (+) SUBJECT + HAVE / HAS + PAST PARTICIPLE

I have seen the news broadcast this morning.

➤ (-) SUBJECT + HAVEN'T / HASN'T + PAST PARTICIPLE

She hasn't read the fashion magazine.

➤ (?) HAVE / HAS + SUBJECT + PAST PARTICIPLE

Have you seen the new soap opera?

We use “for” and “since” to say how long something has happened.

How long have you seen the music program?



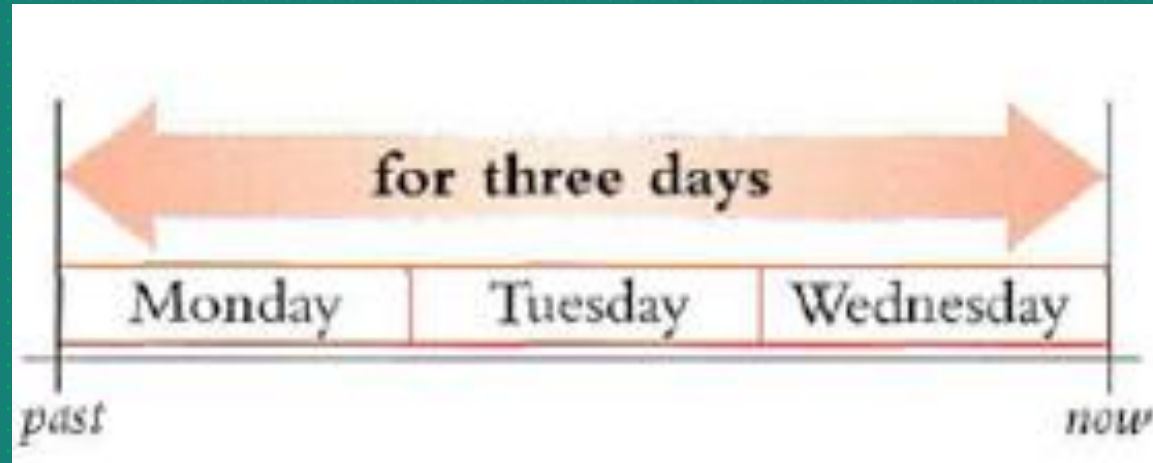
LET'S SEE THE FOLLOWING EXAMPLE...

- Jane is seeing a new sitcom.
- She started to see the sitcom on Monday.
- Today is Thursday.
- *How long has she seen the program?*
- She has seen the sitcom since Monday.
- She has seen the sitcom for 3 days.



“FOR”

- We use “for” + a period of time:

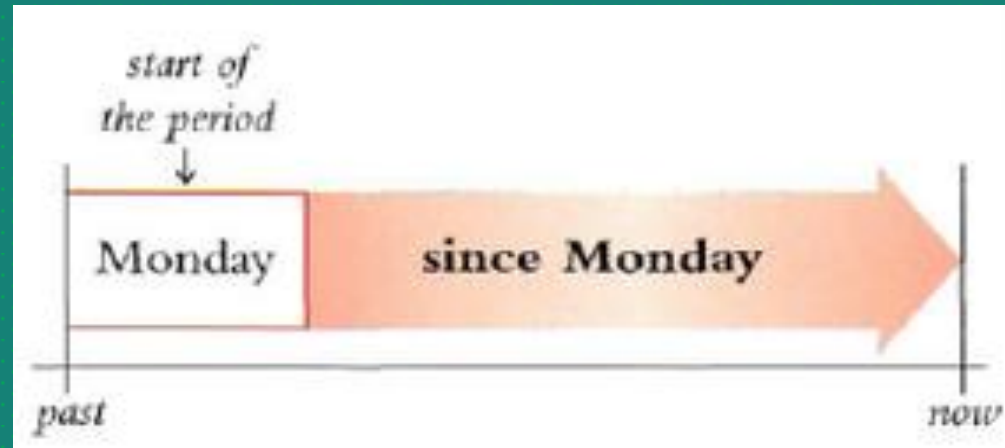


- He has watched movies **for 2 hours**.
- They have listened to the radio **for 12 years**.
- You have been in a reality show **for 3 weeks**.

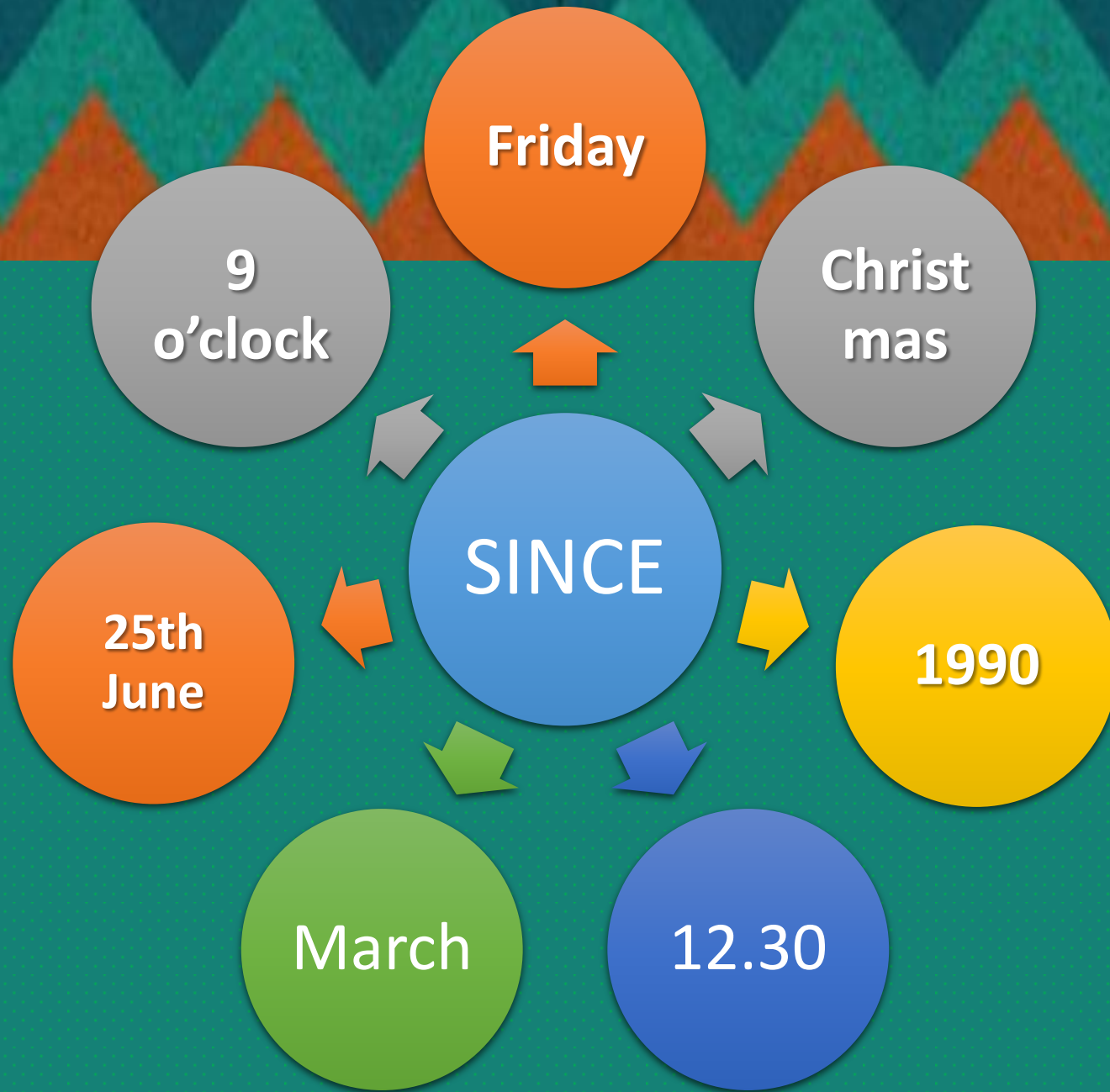


“SINCE”

- We use “since” + the start of a period of time.



- He has been on the news **since Tuesday.**
- They have watched T.V. **since noon.**
- The radio station has broadcasted **since 3 o'clock.**

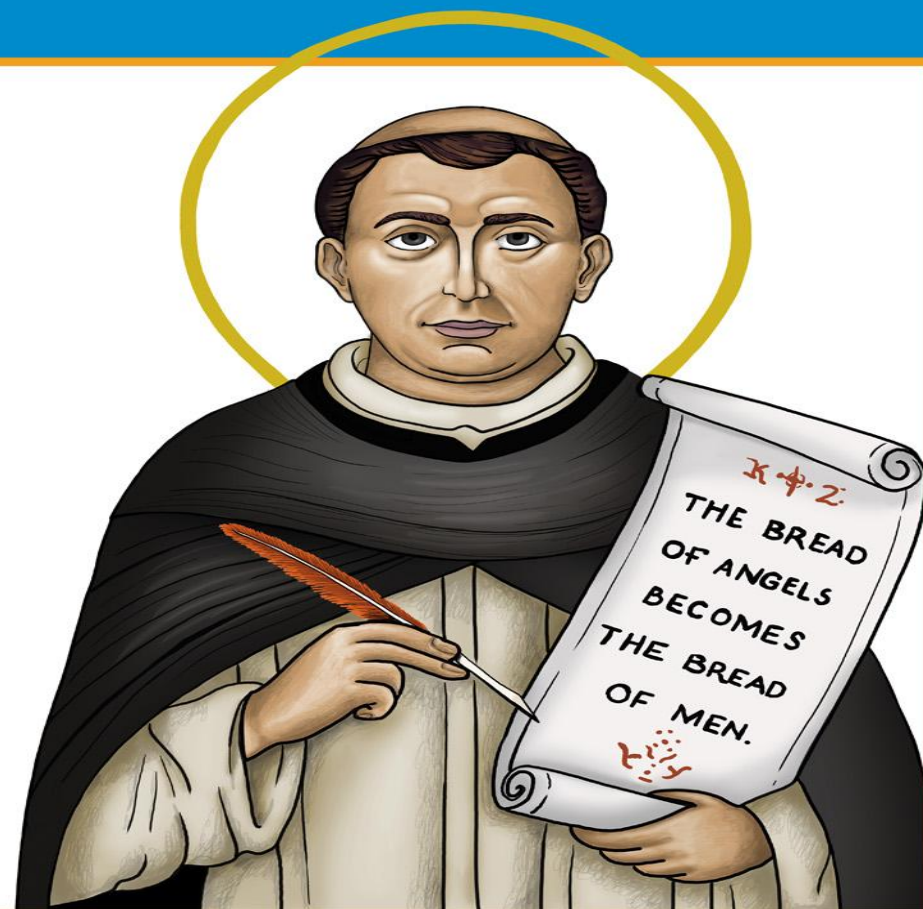
